21620	Enrolment Report	Associate Superintendent A. Kallal provided an overview of the enrolment report. The district is seeing continuous growth in both Div 2 and Junior High. With the opening of Christina Gordon Public School and the expansion of École McTavish Junior High School the district will have two additional options for growth north of the river. The District continues to work with increasing programming options for all our schools. To summarize, the District looks for continued growth in the years ahead based on programming and location of schools.

21622	PAT and Diploma Results	Summary of Accomplishments 2015: Associate Superintendent B. Sautner provided a summary. Some of the data for the Accountability Pillars is collected through various surveys conducted to obtain feedback from parents and students. The survey's are not conducted by FMPSD. Compared to other students in the province, our Diploma Exam results have declined.
		2015 Accountability Pillar Overall Summary: A summary was presented. FMPSD scored high on the Safe and Caring Schools. Overall, we have maintained a good rating. The dropout rate is an issue for all of the province, not just FMPSD. Discussions continue with administration on the importance of results. All results are equally important, not just Provincial Achievement Tests. When school administrators present their School Growth Plans to Trustees in January they will share their strategies for improvement. Information

	on the importance of continued parental involvement at all grades will be shared with parents at the Joint Networks Committee Meeting.  Superintendent D. Nicholl shared there will be a change in the way diploma exams are calculated this year. There is always something to work on and we will continue to build on strengths. We will be taking a closer look at the results to see if there are some teaching or learning gaps that need to be addressed.  Board Chair J.
